Owing to the steady advance in the price of tin, antimony, lead, and copper, the price of type has been advanced as follows: 2d. per lb. on all classes of letters, borders, etc., and 1d. per lb. on quads, leads, clumps, quotations and metal furniture. There seems to be some justification for this step, for in ten years the market price of tin has advanced from £65 per ton to £165 per ton, whilst the remaining metals used have almost doubled in price. With this advance a corresponding increase is being allowed for old type.

The United States Ambassador, the Hon. Whitelaw Reid, has consented to preside at the forthcoming anniversary dinner of the Newspaper Press Fund to be held in May next.

Since the inception of the Company, the dividends paid by the Amalgamated Press, Ltd., have been as follows: 1897, 20 per cent.; 1898, $22\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.; 1899, 25 per cent.; 1900, 30 per cent.; 1901, 35 per cent.; 1902, 40 per cent.; 1903, 40 per cent.; 1904, 35 per cent.; 1905, 40 per cent.

It cannot be gainsaid that for its best interests, further consolidation is necessary in the printing trade. One means towards this end was suggested by Mr. J. E. T. Allen at the last dinner of the London Master Printers' Association. The speaker said that the work performed by the Association as a body was of vital importance to printers, and if that point were more appreciated he did not hesitate to say that the membership would practically include everyone calling himself a master printer.

If employing printers were as well posted on the cost of manufacture as are employers in other lines of manufacture requiring the same amount of capital, there would most probably be as many well-to-do printers as there are rich manufacturers.—"The Progressive Printer."





An Art Training Essential. With the advance of education a greater demand is made upon the intelligence of every business man, and especially is this the case in those branches of commercial industry that can in any

way be associated with the artistic faculty. To prove the truth of this statement, one has only to look round and see the immense strides that have been made within the last fifty years in the furniture, pottery, textile, and other trades. An even more marked advance has been made in the printing trades, for printing has very appropriately been described as the handmaid of art, and the two are so intimately connected in many ways that they must of necessity go hand in hand. Compare, for instance, such productions as the Inland Printer, or the last issue of the Process Year Book, with similar productions of but a few years ago, and every member of the craft will agree that a new era is evident. It is not so much on the purely mechanical side of the business (although in this direction there has been a marked development within the past few years), but it is on the art side that the progress is most noticeable. Whilst this is so, there are many printers who seem to have arrived at a point at which further progress is most difficult, but the man of business should always recollect that in these days of keen competition, there is no such thing as standing still, and he who is not pressing forward is slipping back. One means towards advancement, and perhaps the principal one, is to develop the art side of your business, so as to always have something fresh and striking in the way of designs, and to produce colours that are effective and harmonise with one another. Employ only those artists who are efficient in their calling, and if possible try to secure those comps, who are acquainted with the fundamental principles of drawing and colour. To quote the words of Walter Crane, "This potentiality for art exists in a rudimentary way, though in very varying degrees, in perhaps all individuals." Encourage, therefore, this faculty in all your workpeople and it cannot but repay you, and what is most important of all, keep you ever in the van of progress. A writer in Printing Art truly says: "Printing, in its broad sense no longer suggests routine forms of mere mechanical equipment and processes. It involves the active and full use of the best that has been developed in illustration, design, engraving, colour, types and papers.



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

WHAT OTHERS TO ARE DOING

If rumour is correct the proprietors of several American magazines are having a number of issues printed in advance. It appears that the reason for this step is in anticipation of the general strike amongst printers.

Messrs. Raphael Tuck and Sons, Ltd., are offering £100 for the best suggestion for a fourth Postcard Collectors' Competition. The latest date for receiving suggestions, which must be made on a Tuck Picture Postcard, is February 15th.

There have been in Germany, during the past year, about 2,000 strikes. Of this number 21 were connected with the paper trade, and 23 with the printing trade. In the majority of instances the raison d'etre was the demand for more wages, a demand which was generally conceded.

Another new composing machine has been placed on the German market. Reference is made to the "Electrotypograph." The keys, of which there are ninety, are arranged in exactly the same way as in any standard typewriter, so that anyone conversant with the latter can work the former, and at about the same speed.

Of the twenty-nine composing machines in the offices of The Brooklyn Eagle, New York, five are operated by members of the fair sex. The manager of the above publication, in a recent interview, announces that the women operators were eminently satisfactory. They turn out, on an average, from 35,000 to 40,000 ems a day, which is indeed a better record than some of the men make. In fact, with the exception of tabular work, women are found to do as well as men, and for the same work they receive the same rate of wages.

Attention was drawn at a recent meeting of the Association of German Master Printers to the multiplicity of type-faces, and to the undesirability of type-founders increasing their number. It was held that the system necessitated the constant purchase of new type by those printers who at all wished to be up-to-date and, in consequence, was a great strain upon many members of the craft. The uniformity of type-bodies was also thought to be eminently desirable, and a resolution was passed to the effect that the founders should be given five years to standardise their fonts; failing which, printers would probably be recommended to boycott the defaulters.
